- All participants are to pay for their own travel to and from Nairobi, and to and from the conference venue.
- 6. Weather
- February is a moderately hot month in Nairobi, Kenya, with average temperatures ranging between 27°C (80.6°F) and 14.3°C (57.7°F).

### Health Travel Advisory

#### 1. Health Insurance

Get comprehensive <u>travel insurance</u> before you leave. Ideally, your policy needs to cover all overseas medical costs, including medical evacuation. This applies to everyone, no matter how healthy and fit you are. Confirm:

- what activities and care your policy covers
- that your insurance covers you for the whole time you'll be away.

### 2. Physical and Mental Health

Consider your physical and mental health before you travel, especially if you have an existing medical condition. Consider whether you may be in a vulnerable category for COVID-19.

See your doctor or travel clinic to:

- have a basic health check-up
- ask if your travel plans may affect your health
- plan any vaccinations you need
- get a medical report with vital clinical information, for example about allergies, previous surgeries, current medications, co-morbidities/ pre-existing medical conditions which may come in handy should you require treatment during your stay here in Kenya

Do this at least 8 weeks before you leave.

#### 3. Medication

If you plan to bring medication, check if it is legal in Kenya. Take enough legal medicine for your trip.

Carry a copy of your prescription or a letter from your doctor stating:

- what the medication is and the condition for which it is indicated
- how much you'll take
- that it is for personal use

### 4. Health Risks

#### a. COVID-19

Proof of vaccination for COVID-19 or a negative COVID-19 PCR test conducted not more than 72 hours prior to departure. Monitor from reliable sources such as <u>WHO</u> for latest developments on COVID-19 and follow the advice of local health officials. For information on Kenya's COVID-19 vaccination program, refer to the <u>COVID-19 Self</u> <u>Service Portal</u>. You should consult your local health professional for advice on vaccine options, including assistance that may be available locally.

### b. Insect-borne diseases

Yellow fever is a virus spread by mosquitoes that can cause serious illness. It's prevented by vaccination. Get vaccinated before you travel.

Malaria is widespread except in Nairobi and at altitudes above 2500m. Anti-Malaria medication (recommended, especially if planning to travel outside Nairobi).

Other insect-borne diseases occur, such as:

- <u>Dengue</u>
- <u>Rift valley fever</u>
- African sleeping sickness

To protect yourself from disease:

- make sure your accommodation is insect-proof
- use insect repellent
- wear long, loose light-coloured clothing
- You may consider taking medication to prevent malaria should you visit malaria-endemic regions; visit your primary doctor/physicians for further discussions on the same as well as most suitable options for you.

Visit a doctor if you develop either a fever, muscle pain, a rash or a bad headache. c. HIV/AIDS

HIV/AIDS infection rates are very high. Take precautions if taking part in activities that put you at risk of infection.

d. Other health risks

Waterborne, foodborne and other infectious diseases that may occur include:

- <u>Hepatitis</u>
- <u>Meningococcal disease</u>
- <u>Measles</u>
- <u>Cholera</u>
- <u>Tuberculosis</u>

Serious outbreaks may occur from time to time. To protect yourself from illness:

- drink boiled water or bottled water with sealed lids
- avoid ice cubes
- observe basic hand hygiene, food and water sanitation.
- avoid raw and undercooked food, such as salads

During your stay, visit a doctor if you develop either a fever, diarrhoea, muscle pain, a rash, a bad headache or generally feel unwell.

Before your visit, travellers should consult a travel medicine specialist to obtain the necessary vaccinations required for their trip, as well as in accordance to their medical and vaccination history.
